We are looking forward to a productive partnership with you, to ensure that our children can achieve their full potential. We recognise that in order to be successful at school, our children need support and encouragement from both the home and the school. We know that a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. To this end we encourage you to read our article on 'Contacting on page four of this newsletter.

We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that your child....

*... Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experiences.*

*... Completes all homework tasks and assignments given by the teachers.*

*... Reads daily to develop a love of reading and improve literacy skills.*

*... Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of school life.*

*... Informs you if he/she needs help or support in school so that you can discuss this with the teachers.*

Our commitment to you continues to be to work to provide a well-rounded, holistic education. However children need to attend regularly in order to participate fully. We don't want pupils to come to school ill, but we discourage taking holidays during school time as it causes disruption to the child's learning.

Over the coming days and weeks the children will receive new instructions about entering and leaving the school grounds safely. Please listen to your children as they will have to use gates and doors assigned to their classes. The building work necessitates limited and safe access and the well-being and safety of every member of the school community is our priority.

We also draw your attention to the safety issues that present themselves at the entrance to the school and on the road. Please exercise care and attention when parking or dropping off children. Obey the wardens' instructions at the crossing. Do not block entrances or bus parking spots. Avoid parking across the road from the school as this obscures the footpath. Kildare County Council are currently investigating possibilities for improving the traffic management system at the school, but until such time as these are in place we beg you to be careful. Many of our children walk and cycle to school. Many of our children are very young.

### **Personal Accident Insurance Scheme**

The personal accident insurance cover is available through the school for a cost of €9. Don't forget to complete your form and return it in an envelope to the school office. If you have lost your form, Carol will be able to provide a new one for you.

### **Book Lending Scheme**

The Book Lending Scheme continues at the school this year. The cost of Book Rental is €35 per child or €65 per family. This is great value as the cost of schoolbooks is constantly rising. We thank all that have paid to date and remind everybody to pay at the office. Please remind your children that the books are lent to them and that they should look after the books so that others may use them in the future.

### **Credit Union Savings**

The Credit Union Savings scheme returns to school this year. Lots of children are saving through this scheme. Each Wednesday the Credit Union representative visits the school. The children have a Credit Union Card and they can deposit their savings. The Card is used to record the amount saved so that the children can see how much they have managed to save. ### **School Journals**

All the children at the school have received their homework journals. Please check the journal to see that homework is being completed. The journal is also a method of communicating with the class teacher. Sometimes messages are sent home in the journal. It is important that you check the journal every evening. We thank all the businesses that have sponsored the journals. Without their generous contributions and kind support we would not be able to afford the journals.

### **Health Concerns**

St. Conleth's National School has a policy on the Administration of Medicine. We understand that some children may require medication during the school day. Should you have any such requirements it is essential that you complete and sign the relevant appendix from the school's Administration of Medicine Policy (available from the office). The health and welfare of the children in our care is of paramount importance. We recommend that any child who shows signs of illness should be kept at home; requests from parents to keep their children in at lunch break are not encouraged. A child too sick to play with peers should not be in school. Parents must ensure that teachers are made aware in writing of any medical condition which their child is suffering from. We thank you for your cooperation and support in ensuring the good health of all our children.

### **Healthy Lunches**

Please refer to the school's policy on Healthy Eating which can be found on the school website. Lunch is an important meal for school-going children. It should provide one third of their recommended daily allowance of nutrients without being high in fat, sugar or salt. It should also provide dietary fibre (roughage). In school we strive to enable the children to appreciate the importance of good nutrition for growing and developing and staying healthy. We encourage the children to accept some personal responsibility for making wise food choices and adopting a healthy, balanced diet. We ask that parents provide a healthy lunch. Guidelines are provided in our Healthy Eating Policy. The policy also lists the lunch items that are not allowed at school. Should your child have food allergies of any sort, please make sure that the school has been informed.

## Peace Proms

The school was delighted to participate in the Peace Proms last year. It was a wonderful opportunity for the children to perform in a huge arena to a massive audience. It was a fantastic chance to be part of such an enormous undertaking, involving schools from all over the country. The children were accompanied by the Cross Border Orchestra of Ireland. It is marvellous to have an opportunity to hear a live orchestra, but even better to be able to perform with one.

The Cross Border Orchestra of Ireland (CBOI) was established in 1995 as a peace initiative and is composed of over 100 exceptionally talented young musicians from all over Ireland – north and south. Over the past 20 years, the CBOI has played an important role in building and nurturing vital cross border and cross community relations.

This internationally acclaimed and award winning youth orchestra has performed to sell out audiences at all major venues in Ireland, and many throughout the world including Carnegie Hall New York (2005 and 2014); the Royal Albert Hall, London; Boston Symphony Hall; Chicago Symphony Hall; and the Oriental Arts Centre Shanghai; the World Trade Expo, Shanghai where they won an international music award for "Outstanding Performance".

The CBOI plays a unique blend of symphonic traditional and folk music, which evokes the rich heritage and culture of Ireland. This full symphony orchestra also incorporates traditional instruments for example Uilleann Pipes and Bagpipes. Our core message of *universal peace* remains central to our music and our mission.

This year we have decided to take part in the Peace Proms again. Forms should soon arrive for the children. Please complete the forms and return them to school so that they can be forwarded to the project organisers.
